2	Summary of the work to date		
	ST gave an overview of the process of drawing up the draft Wellbeing Plan for 2023-2028. It was noted that the plan incorporated comments that had arisen during the Workshops held over Summer 2022 led by Co-Pro Cymru.		
	The importance of adding value rather than duplicating work was noted.		
	It was noted that priorities had been weighed up using the wellbeing assessments, a questionnaire and the workshops as criteria.
